## NOTE IN THE POCKET SUPPORTS FAMILIES EXPERIENCING CLOTHING INSECURITY

### What is clothing insecurity?

- Clothing insecurity is the lack of sufficient, on-trend and size-adequate clothing. This can [impact](#) a child's educational and emotional growth, and social well-being.
- According to a 2021 [report](#) by the U.S. Census Bureau, approximately 11% of families in Wake County live below the poverty line. This indicates that in addition to food and housing insecurity, children may struggle to receive proper clothing.

### How does Note in the Pocket identify children and families in need?

- Note in the Pocket identifies children in need with the help of community social service agencies and [referral partners](#). These include the Boys and Girls Clubs of Wake County, Project CATCH, the Salvation Army, Raleigh Rescue Mission and more.
